Draft Concept Note: 'World Radio Day (WRD) 2025: Fostering Global Collaboration and Encouraging Access to Information.'

Introduction

One of UNESCO Aruba's priorities is to recognize and celebrate the United Nations' international days. Yearly on February 13th, the focus is on World Radio Day (WRD). It is the first international day of the year that highlights communication, access to information, and collaboration through the role of radio worldwide.

This is a chance to share how UNESCO Aruba connects local stations with a global network. By registering on UNESCO's website at Unesco.org, stations can be featured on a world map, helping them discover new partners and resources to celebrate Radio Day.

UNESCO encourages all countries to celebrate this day by joining activities with different partners, such as local, regional, and international radio networks, broadcasting associations, media organizations, NGOs, and everyone in public (World Radio Day, 2025).
